



ACCREDITATION

In 2007, The State of Texas Supreme Court ruled that biblically based institutions of higher learning do not have to be accredited by the State Education Agency.

Harvest Ministry Seminary (HMS) therefore chose not to be State accredited, and to not pursue accreditation. We have chosen to remain autonomous for the following reasons: (1) The expense of State accreditation would require higher expenses, which would be passed on to students. Autonomy enables HMS to maintain low tuition fees; (2) We desire to maintain doctrinal autonomy; and (3) To utilize our future HMS educated faculty to ensure theological and philosophical consistency – pursuit of accreditation would limit this goal.

Finally, our academic standards are of the highest quality and our instructors are distinguished in their respective academic fields. We believe HMS graduates to be exemplary examples of biblical understanding, and their abilities in expositional and exegetical disciplines unquestionable. HMS is accountable to its Church founders, and its Corporate Board, and Advisors to maintain the highest standards of excellence.
